## The Juget-Sinclair French Romantic Organ

An organ unique in North America, Juget-Sinclair's opus 45, completed in 2016, seeks to replicate the experience of playing and hearing a late nineteenth century organ by the master of French organbuilding, Aristide Cavaillé-Coll. The twenty-one stops provide an amazing range of sounds perfect for the French romantic repertoire, yet also extremely effective with music of other styles. Careful study went into the visual, tonal, and mechanical design. Aside from the electric blower, the organ's action is entirely mechanical. Services primarily utilize the forms in Evangelical Lutheran Worship, and enact the priesthood of all believers by inviting members to share their God-given gifts of leadership, including musical.
